They started to write their own music and released their first CD, "Red Dirt," in 2004. The group is composed of: Paul Doxey, M.D., an Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon (guitar), John Davis, M.D., a radiologist (percussion and vocals), Steve Coleman, EMT (bass guitar), Larry Staples, D.D.S., (key boards), Jason Ahee, M.D., an ophthalmologist (guitar) and John Miner, M.D., an anesthesiologist (lead vocals).
